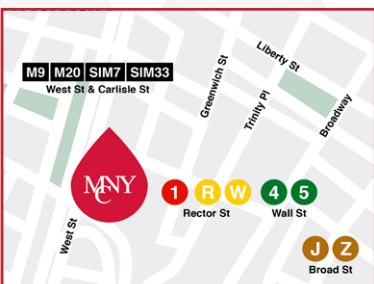
This program will allow you to
