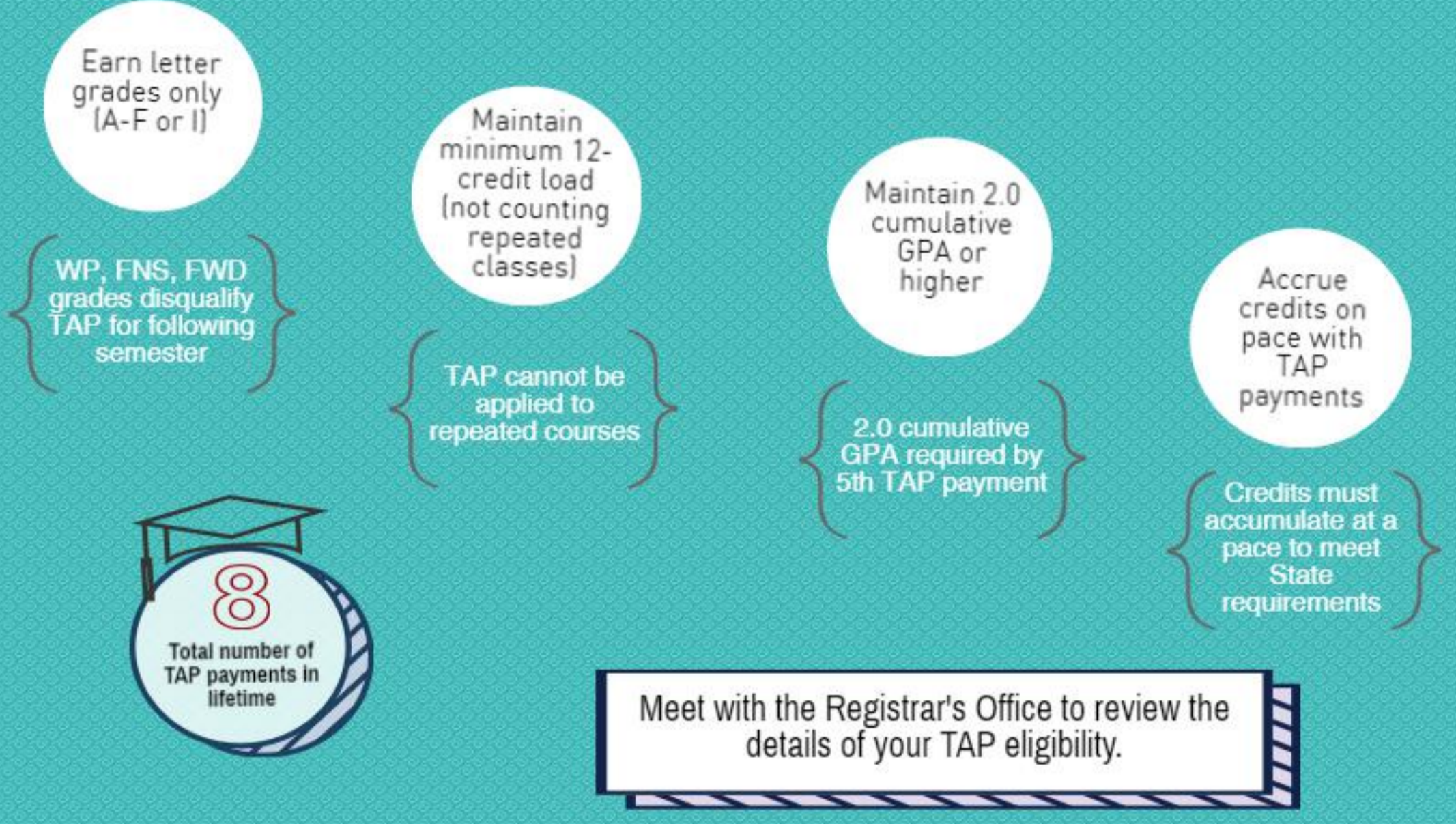

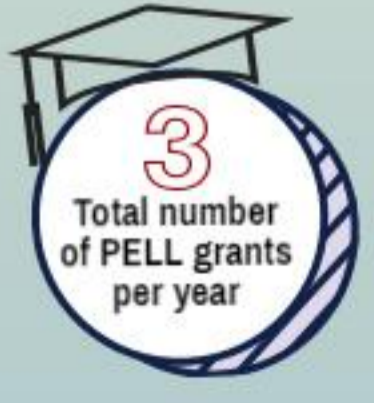
Qualifying for TAP Grants
 The New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) helps eligible New York residents pay tuition at approved schools in New York State. Because TAP is a grant, it does not have to be paid back.



SAP Satisfactory Academic Progress to qualify for Federal Aid

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) is the federal requirement that students make real and measurable progress toward their degree in order to be eligible to receive federal aid.

Standards	Minimum Requirement
GPA	Undergraduate Students: Maintain a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0
	Graduate Students: Maintain a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0
Pace	Complete a cumulative minimum of 67% of credits attempted
Maximum Timeframe	Credits attempted may not exceed 150% of the standard number of credits required for your primary degree program (Associate: 90; Bachelor: 180; Graduate: 67.5)
