Metropolitan College of New York, a not-for-profit institution accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, was founded by Audrey Cohen in 1964. The College was born out of the turbulence of the 1960s in response to the demand for college curricula and degrees to address a changing society, as well as the needs of its new students. MCNY's unique model of education is focused on two innovative ideas: Purpose-Centered Education and experiential learning within the framework of equity and social justice.

Experiential Learning

At the core of the MCNY educational experience is the concept of Constructive Action. 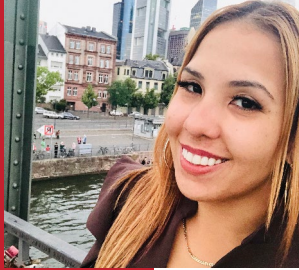

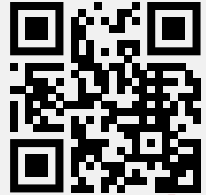
