

Academic Master Plan



MCNY Successfully Executes Academic Master Plan (2023-2028), Focusing on Innovation and Student Success

MCNY embarked on a transformative journey to develop its Academic Master Plan for the years 2023-2028. This ambitious plan aimed to elevate academic excellence while championing equity, social justice, and Purpose-Centered Education as fundamental principles.

Under the leadership of the Office of Academic Affairs (OAA), three dynamic working groups were established to spearhead the development of the Academic Master Plan:

- •Curriculum Re-design & Innovation: This group was tasked with shaping the future of academic pathways in Business, Human Services & Education, and Public Affairs and Administration. Their mission was to ensure the curriculum remained forward-thinking, socially responsive, and grounded in purpose-centered education.
- •Teaching Excellence & Scholarship: With a focus on enhancing teaching effectiveness, ensuring quality assurance, and supporting scholarly endeavors, this group aimed to raise the bar for teaching and research within the institution. They also coordinated grants, research, and scholarly pursuits across disciplines.
- •Student Engagement & Success: Recognizing the pivotal role of students, this group developed strategies to enhance student success in areas such as retention, completion, transfers, and career progression.

The development of the Academic Master Plan followed a meticulously planned timeline:

- •Spring 2023: The OAA gathered top priorities through comprehensive data collection.
- **Summer 2023:** A thorough SWOT analysis was conducted, and working groups were formed and appointed. Faculty surveys were administered, and Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) were defined.
- •Fall 2023: The drafting, finalization, and endorsement of pivotal Academic Master Plan documents took place, accompanied by the launch of a dedicated website for OAA's Strategic Priorities & Initiatives.

Black Maternal Health


Initiative

The Black Maternal Health Initiative Remains
Committed with TD Grant



The MCNY Black Maternal Health Initiative (BMHI) is a student and community engagement project responding to the existential crisis of Black maternal health in the U.S., New York City, and most specifically, in our Bronx community. It has been developed and stewarded by the MCNY Library.

In February of 2023, MCNY received a TD Bank Ready Commitment grant from the TD Charitable Foundation aimed at advancing awareness of the Black Maternal Health crisis, the health equity crisis in maternal care for birthing people of color and supporting NYC advocacy









The crisis is a hot topic throughout New York and has brought city leaders together on a united front. MCNY has been the lead College on the topic and a platform for the Bronx Borough President Vanessa Gibson along with Public Advocate Jumaane Williams and NYC Council Speaker Adrienne Adams, who have all joined the Black Maternal Health Zoom discussion to share their personal experiences and thoughts on systemic racism and our healthcare system. In addition, MCNY Librarian Tina Callender was invited to join a city-wide panel of experts hosted and presented by NYC Council Speaker Adrienne Adams, "Birth & Beyond Brunch and Discussion" to raise awareness of the crisis.

In 2022, MCNY implemented HandShake, a space specific to MCNY students to find current job postings, employer hiring events and create networking opportunities. In 2023, the College launched a soft campaign to bring alumni into the fold. HandShake offers alumni and students the opportunity to connect and network with over 850,000 employers and 13 million other HandShake users representing 1400 educational institutions in the US. It is a powerful job search and networking tool and is cost-free for our students and alumni.
